### Next Steps

It's great that so many families consider their experience of Homelearning to be excellent, very good or good- and teachers are committed to improving all the time for every student - as well as for individuals who have found Homelearning a real struggle.

- Although over 70% of families say the quantity of homelearning is about right (or there's not enough), a significant number report that there is too much or far too much- although these are spread across year groups. Nearly all families reporting that there is too much home learning also reported barriers to learning, most commonly that parents were key workers.
  - Teachers are aware of families who report that there is too much homelearning and will be making changes accordingly.
  - Pastoral Teachers and Pupil Support are monitoring and supporting students who face barriers to Homelearning.
  - The quality of Homelearning is of greater importance than the quantity and teachers will be planning even more focused Homelearning for August when 'Blended Learning' begins ie a blend of in-school and homelearning.

- The vast majority (75) report that Homelearning is at the right level- with 2 families saying Homelearning is too easy and 6 saying it is too difficult.

- As ever, we urge parents and students to get in touch with subject teachers or pastoral teachers to help us get this right.




### Next Steps


### Next Steps


### Next Steps

- Feedback is vital. Overall, families rated Homelearning Feedback between Very Good and Good. We are not happy with this because we know how excellent feedback really accelerates learning. Feedback is the Professional Development priority for teachers 2020-21 and we will be working in June to establish the most effective ways to give feedback in the 'Blended learning' phase from August.
  - Although the significant majority of respondents said feedback was both useful and timely, a large number said it was useful but not timely. As teachers, we know that quick feedback is more effective. We are grateful that so many comments acknowledged that many teachers also face challenges at home during this time and that really quick feedback has not always been possible. We will do our utmost to be as efficient as possible.
  - Teachers will respond accordingly to those students who have not found feedback useful or timely.

### Next Steps

- Most families have a barrier of one kind or another and Teachers and Pupil Support team will be examining how we can help.
- A significant number of parents/carers are key workers- and it is of course hoped that others will soon be able to return to work as lockdown eases. Teachers will be assessing how this should inform our approach to Blended learning re quantity and style of Homelearning.
- Internet connectivity is a challenge for many- and for many teachers too. We are working with SBC to see what we can do to support families with unreliable or poor quality connectivity. Currently, we are supporting some families by emailing work or delivering paper copies.
