Joan said: "Thinking about what options to choose at school can be daunting for young people and their parents and carers. As well as this session, SDS also has a Subject Choices tool on SDS's My World of Work website which helps pupils explore where options choices can take them. "It gives young people and their parents and carers the opportunity to explore job profiles, industries, Foundation and Modern Apprenticeships, refine their search by what someone is most interested in and use the tool as many times as they like to find out more about different options. "There are other tools to try and the more tools you try, the better career suggestions we can give."
