HEALTHY START	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The link between performance and a healthy start is really clear and thank you for supporting this. Breakfast club is available at the school every day. 	✓
UNIFORM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Pupils who wear the full school uniform contribute enormously to the purposeful atmosphere, high standards and high expectations at the school as well as a sense of equality and fairness amongst our students. Students are expected to arrive at school in full school uniform every day - and to bring PE Kit in a bag. We thank you for supporting this. IPAD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The ipad is now the 'school bag' of students at SHS- it's vital that students look after their ipads responsibly and bring their fully charged ipad to school each day. 	✓
MOBILE PHONES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is very clear to us that students who carry their phones about or have them in pockets during class are continually aware of them and easily and often distracted from their learning. iPads mean that phones no longer have any role in class. More than ever, students (and everyone else!) are finding it difficult to separate themselves from their phones. In addition to the impact on learning, we are aware of significantly negative impact of social media on mental health. To encourage a more balanced relationship with phones, we therefore require S1/2/3 students to keep their phones at home. If parents need students to have their mobile for particular reasons, please inform the school: in this case, mobiles should be out of sight or handed to the office during the school day. If senior students bring mobiles to school, they must be in bags and out of sight during class time. Parents and Carers are asked not to contact their children's mobiles during class time. 	✓ ✓ ✓ ✓
LUNCH-TIMES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The performance of students in the afternoon who have a high sugar lunch appears to be very significantly less effective than students who make healthy choices. If you are not confident your child is making healthy choices in the town, please consider a packed lunch or our canteen. We do not allow energy drinks or sugary drinks in school. 	✓

All pupils should arrive at school smartly dressed and ready to learn

- **A white shirt and school tie** tied at the top (ties are provided by the school through parent pay)
- **A plain black V-neck jumper, cardigan or black sweat shirt** - not hoodie *
- **Black tailored trousers or black shorts/skirt** - not jeans or leggings
- **Smart, sensible, black school shoes**
- **House T-Shirt** (provided by school through parent pay)
- **S6 SHS School Jacket** (provided by school through parent pay)
- **School hoodies** or other branded sports kit are not to be worn in classes except on match days.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS & HELP WITH UNIFORM

SBC can provide children with free school meals and financial assistance towards the purchase of school clothing. The current amount payable is £150 per qualifying child.

All children in primary one to three are automatically eligible for a free school meal. For all other children to qualify, you must meet one of the following criteria...

SCHOOL CLOTHING & FOOTWEAR GRANT

Council Tax Reduction (based on income assessment)

Income Support

Income based Job Seeker's Allowance

Any income related element of Employment and Support Allowance

Working Tax Credit and/or Child Tax Credit with an income less than £19,995

Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Universal Credit with monthly earnings not exceeding £796

The clothing grant is only paid once per child per school year between August and the following March.
