

The initiative, which launched this month, offers students the chance to learn fly fishing and casting techniques while also developing key meta-skills in literacy, numeracy, and event organisation.

The year-long programme is designed to engage students through hands-on learning in one of Scotland's most iconic outdoor settings. As part of the course, pupils will explore the art of fly fishing and gain experience in planning and running angling-related events.
